## Breast Cancer Tournament Tuesday, 10/11/22      **Ingela Butters/Kim Hall**

- Ingela introduced her committee and emphasized that many Lincsters have fought, or are fighting, their own battle. Nationally one in five women will experience breast cancer.
- Last year we donated \$21,300 and we have a target goal of \$25-30K. \$5,000.86 has been raised to date.
- All funds go directly to Breast Cancer in Placer County. Money is used toward research at UC Davis and Outreach programs in Placer and Sacramento counties, and high school education.
- Those attending today received an informational packet on fundraising and what else is needed. A packet will be disbursed to those not in attendance. The packet included:

**Rules**                                      **Laura Niles**

- The difference between Free Relief and Unplayable (one stroke penalty) was explained and a short NCGA video was shown.
- There are a lot of videos on the NCGA site explaining the rules.
- Ground Under Repair – the committee will review options regarding improving lies on the Orchard Course.
- Sand – you may move your ball out of a footprint to the nearest point of relief.
- Sand - Two stroke penalty, plus place your ball behind the sand trap if you do not wish to attempt hitting out.
- Clarified Orchard Hole #13-14 rules. NOTE: Full rules are printed on your scorecard.
  - #13 – If you hit into the water, it is a hazard and you take a lateral drop.
  - #14 – The “no penalty drop” ONLY applies if your teammates agree that you cleared the water and landed in the swampy environmental area beyond the water.

- If you hit into the water and go to the drop area that is a one stroke penalty.
- Two stroke penalty if you pick up after the Lincsters sign and go to drop area.
